TOTAL SOLAR ECLIPSE IS COMING TO NEW YORK STATE ON APRIL 8TH!

On April 8th, large portions of the state will experience a Total Solar Eclipse. Depending on location, from between 1 1/2 and 4 minutes, the moon will pass between the sun and earth, completely blocking the sun and causing the sky to go dark. From Buffalo, Rochester and Syracuse to the shores of Lake Ontario and the Adirondacks, New York State will have a front row view for this awe inspiring event.

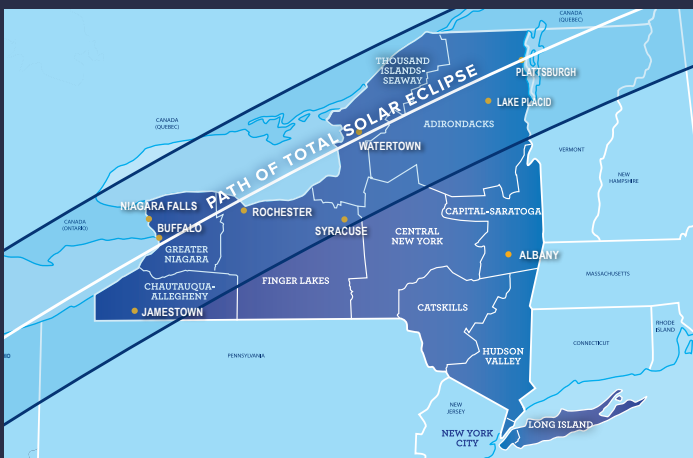
HERE ARE SOME TIPS TO ENSURE YOU ENJOY THE ECLIPSE SAFELY

- Due to expected heavy traffic and crowds, monitor traffic updates and follow directions
- Only view in designated public areas
- Wear sunscreen and check weather forecasts
